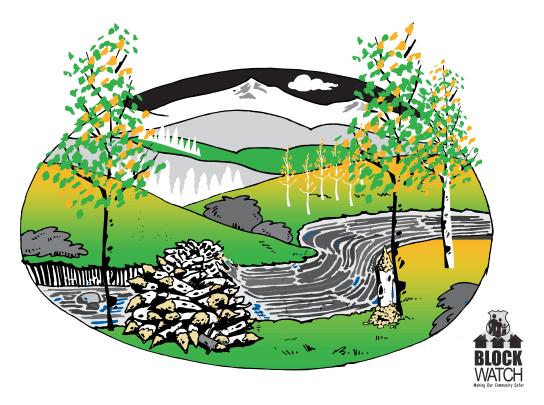

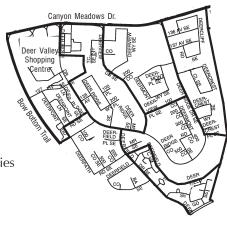

Message From Peter Demong Alderman Ward 14



Howdy (and a tip of the hat),

The next hundred years of the Stampede is soon to begin. Yahoo! I hope you get out and enjoy it, right after you read this tale of \$52 million.

Your property tax bill is broken into two parts: the city's property tax, and the education tax that the city collects and remits to the province. In March 2013, the Province decided they were going to give you a break on the education portion of your property taxes. This amounts to about \$52 million in total, or about \$126 annually for the average residential property owner. Two years ago, Council voted to automatically take any 'vacated' tax surplus from the Province (I voted against this).

That is how Council ended up with \$52 million, and it is not "one-time money". This will become part of the base property tax that you pay every year, onto which all future increases will be compounded.

It is my job to listen to what you have to say. There are five choices for how this money could be spent, and I URGE you to contact me with your opinion, because I AM listening. The issue will be coming to Council on July 22^{nd} .

It is also my job to cast a vote on this issue, and it is no secret that giving it back to taxpayers is my current favourite. Some have said that this option would make no difference to Calgarians because \$126 dollars is such a small sum. Calling any sum of money irrelevant sets a dangerous precedent, but for now let's assume that an extra \$126 in your pocket is inconsequential because that is not really the point. The point is the \$126 is not extra for you; it's extra for the City! The point is that the Provincial government lowered taxes, so YOU could get the money back! If the city continued to charge 7% GST when it was lowered to 5%, I wonder how well that would have been accepted.

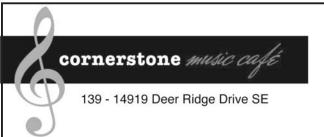

Crime Prevention Delivered To Your Inbox

The Calgary Police Service is going digital with community crime prevention messages.

The Service is expanding the Police and Community Awareness Program (PCAP) to include e-mail and text capabilities, and is being rebranded "The Hub".

Starting March 1, 2013, Calgarians who want information about crime and other activity in their community can sign up to receive voicemail, email or text alerts as part of The Hub, the new CPS information headquarters.

The system, originally known as the Police and Community Telephone (PACT), has sent approximately 2,700 voicemail messages to Calgarians since 1993.

The Hub will alert citizens to important situations such as criminal activity or requests for public assistance in cases such as missing persons. The Hub will also be used for proactive community information such as crime prevention advice, and promotion of community events.

More than 64,000 households and nearly 6,500 businesses subscribed to PCAP. Current subscribers will be required to re-register with the new system in order to keep receiving alerts.

The Hub will also help deliver messages to Calgarians based on several factors including demographics and their geographic location.

Message from Heather Forsyth – M.L.A. Calgary Fish Creek

PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES (PDD)

Thank you to the many Fish Creek residents who've reached out to expressing concerns about the future of PDD programs. I appreciate you sharing your stories with me, and to have an opportunity to respond. I understand the anxiety you feel as the government transitions to a new model of funding and supporting our most vulnerable without telling families like yours what it will mean for their loved ones.

We in the Official Opposition have been challenging the government to explain and justify the cuts they have made to community access supports in this year's budget. Many of our MLA's have asked the Minister, although unfortunately the government and the minister have had very little in the way of details or information regarding the impacts these changes will have on clients, caregivers, families or service providers.

HEAT RELATED ILLNESS



With the return of warmer weather, Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind citizens to stay safe in the heat and sun this summer. While children and the elderly can be more susceptible to the effects of heat, basic prevention measures should be taken by all to avoid a heat related illness during periods of hot and humid weather.

HEAT EXHAUSTION

- Heat exhaustion can occur due to excessive fluid loss during periods of prolonged sweating in a hot and / or humid environment (indoors or outdoors).
- Patients may suffer headaches, weakness, fatigue, nausea / vomiting, thirst, chills, and profuse sweating.
- The patient is usually cold and damp to the touch and the skin

HEAT STROKE

- Heat stroke is a medical emergency that requires prompt treatment. It can be fatal.
- It occurs when the body can't cool itself naturally (e.g. perspiration). The body's temperature will continue to rise to dangerous levels.
- Due to severe dehydration and the inability to sweat the patient may appear flushed and skin may be hot and dry to the touch.

FIRST AID

- First aid for all heat related illness begins with removing or sheltering the patient from the hot environment.
- Remove excess or tight fitting clothing and allow them to rest in a cool environment.
- If the patient is conscious and alert, provide suitable fluids such as water, juice, or a sports drink.
- If you are concerned, seek medical attention or call 9-1-1.

PREVENTION

- Stay well-hydrated by drinking plenty of water.
- Limit alcohol consumption as alcohol dehydrates you.
- Always wear a broad brimmed hat to keep the sun off your face and neck.
- Apply waterproof sunscreen with an SPF of 50+, especially for children. The sun's UV rays peak between 10am-4pm, even on cloudy days.
