Community Update On New Schools

The Calgary Board of Education is pleased to welcome more than 3,000 additional students this year. With rapid growth comes the challenge of finding schools for all these students. Funding for new school construction hasn't kept pace with growth, particularly in new communities. As a result, we bus about a third of our students to schools where there is space.

To meet this pressing need, the CBE is planning the construction of 12 new schools, three major modernizations and two replacement schools, all to open in 2016.

New K- Grade 4 schools for Panorama Hills, Tuscany, Auburn Bay, New Brighton, Copperfield, and Evanston.

New Grades 5 – 9 schools for New Brighton–Copperfield, Evergreen, Mackenzie Towne, Saddle Ridge, Rocky Ridge–Royal Oak.

Modernization of Bowness High School and Jack James High School, and turning the former Harold W. Riley school into an Aboriginal learning centre.

Replacement of Christine Meikle and Elbow Park schools.

The Province is also building a new northeast high school to open in 2016.

In addition, the Province announced Sept. 22 that it would partner with the CBE to build four starter schools. They will be built in phases to get students into classes before the entire school is complete. It also announced funding for modular classrooms for Westgate School and for the planning of a new south Calgary high school.

Funding for new schools, modernizations and modulars comes from the province and the CBE is very grateful to the government for this investment in education.

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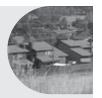
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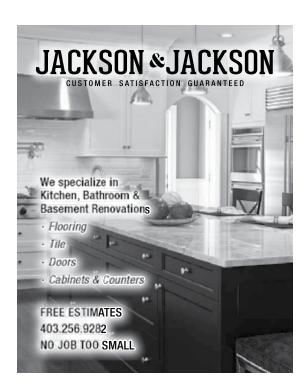

Remembrance Day

Every year on November 11, we observe the tradition of Remembrance Day on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month by pausing in a moment of silence to honour and remember the men and women who have served, and continue to serve our country during times of war, conflict and peace. We remember the more than 1,500,000 Canadians who have served throughout our nation's history and the more than 118,000 who made the ultimate sacrifice.

Scrapping Long-Term Care Cuts Not Enough, More Nursing Beds Still Needed

On September 26th we issued a News Release indicating that reports surfacing in late September showed the number of seniors waiting to be discharged from hospital and placed in an appropriate care bed, otherwise known as Alternate Level of Care (ALC) patients, has nearly doubled over the last decade. A lack of action from government will have dire consequences. I stated: "Albertans have been waiting for action on this file for half a decade now. Quite frankly, it's unacceptable that seniors are being warehoused in emergency rooms, hallways, and broom closets because there's no long-term care capacity. Our hospitals are jammed with patients who could be placed in much more comfortable and appropriate beds. This is not only costing taxpayers a ton of money, but there's also a cost to the quality of life for these patients."

Who Let The Dogs Out?

This summer, Albertans were asked to voluntarily have their boats checked for invasive mussels when they crossed our borders. If you stopped at an inspection station (there are four, located on major highways entering the province and two roving crews), you likely saw the Alberta Government's watercraft inspectors who thoroughly inspect every watercraft that stops – but to do a really complete job, they get a little help from some furry friends. Boats are full of nooks and crannies that can't be seen by the naked eye. Invasive mussels can catch a ride in these areas – and remain undetected by human inspectors. Sniffer dogs, however, rely on their noses – not their eyes – to locate mussels.

This program isn't just good for our ecosystem – it's good for the dogs too! The same characteristics that make some dogs less likely to be adopted from shelters (like high energy levels and an inquisitive nature) make them great candidates to help sniff out mussels and other invasive species. Many Albertans stopped for an inspection this summer, yet the fact remains that just as many people didn't stop. An infestation could cost our province as much as \$75 million per year to fight, and it's the responsibility of every boat owner to prevent that from happening. Please get inspected.

Four Constituencies

By the time you read this, we'll know the results of the October 27th by-elections in Calgary Elbow, Calgary Foothills, Calgary West, and Edmonton Whitemud. With the newly elected candidates, we are now ready for what promises to be a lively and informative session of the legislature, beginning with the Throne Speech on November 17, 2014.

December festivities and celebrations are just around the corner, and I'd like to invite you to my Annual Christmas Open House on Saturday, November 29, 11:00 am – 1:00 pm at the constituency office. I look forward to visiting with you.

to help motivate you once again.

Avoid thinking about a single exercise in your program that you don't enjoy doing and allowing that to stop you from completing the rest of the routine. Instead, go to the gym and begin with anything except the exercises you least enjoy. It's amazing how often just getting moving increases your energy level and motivates you to do the things you enjoy the least.

Vary your program. This is called cross-training. For example, if you usually run on the treadmill, choose the exercise cycle or an elliptical instead. Even the best programs get stale over time. Every six weeks, or so, re-write your program to keep it fresh.

Find a reliable partner to work out with. Exercising with a friend helps keep individuals accountable to each other and increases the probability that one will feel motivated on days when the other does not.
