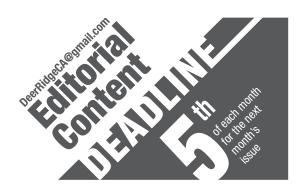

MESSAGE FROM THE DEER RIDGE BOARD

It's getting to be that time of year again - winter. Now before you start making plans to be in Hawaii, Mexico or Arizona, let me point out that your community needs you. The outdoor skating rinks of Deer Ridge Community Association have been the envy of several neighbouring communities, if not the southeast guadrant of Calgary for several years. There are two reasons for this; 1) Superior equipment in the form of an Olympia ice resurfacing machine and a 38", 13 horsepower two stage snowblower. 2) A dedicated crew of two or three people who work about an hour to 90 minutes a day during the week and a couple of hours on Saturday and Sunday mornings (these times would be extended in the case of snow removal being required). It has been my responsibility to see that the rinks have the best surface for skating as soon as possible and to keep that surface ready to be used. After 19 years in various capacities with both the board of directors of Deer Ridge Community Association and rink maintenance, I have decided to retire effective June 2015. To that end, it would be helpful for whoever is going to look after the rink in the future to be able to observe, learn and put into practice what I have been doing. It is not rocket science, just attention to detail and a bit of work to clear snow. Free Red Cross Babysitter's Program

The Deer Ridge Community Association is sponsoring a Red Cross Babysitter's Program for children of Deer Ridge Community Member households.

The course date is tentative, pending enrolment, for Saturday, March 7, 2015 from 9:00 am – 5:00 pm. There will be breaks for snack and lunch. Students must be at least 11 years old and have permission of their parent/guardian to attend.

The Deer Ridge Community Association is covering the costs for the program however there is a \$15.00 advanced deposit required to be paid to the Deer Ridge Community Association. The deposit will be returned in full upon attendance of the course or, if notification is provided three weeks in advance of class date.

A current 2014-2015 Deer Ridge Community Association Membership is required (one membership per household). Please see the Membership Form page in this newsletter to renew/apply.

The program is being instructed by "Alberta Health and Safety Training Institute" (AHSTI).

The following is the program description provided by AHSTI:

This course is designed for responsible adolescents of 11 years and up who want to become a babysitter or may already be one. Red Cross Babysitter courses covers the responsibilities of a babysitter, safety tips for children of all ages, feeding and diapering babies, basic child care skills, and what to do in case of an emergency. Basic first-aid is also covered with rescue-breathing, choking, cuts, burn, etc. Each student will receive a Red Cross babysitter's manual, and a Red Cross Babysitter's completion card.

COMMUNITY business of the month

he most frequently asked question I get is, "How can I get my fresh cut flowers to last?"

Flowers, you may be surprised to find, require special care once you bring them home.

There are so many techniques used by professional growers and florists to ensure that you receive the freshest and most vibrant flowers possible. However, the reality is that the chain of life, as we call it, ends with you. I believe an educated customer is a happy customer, so please consider these basic points of botany when preparing and caring for your fresh cut flowers at home.

Upon arrival home, prepare a vase of room temperature water, dissolve the packet of flower food that came with your fresh purchase in the water. There is the proper concentration of glucose to feed cut flowers and biocide to keep the water clean longer for one litre of water. If you did not receive this packet, mix one tsp. of sugar and two drops of bleach into water.

After unwrapping your beautiful bouquet, remove any foliage that will likely be below your water level. Foliage will decay faster under water and cause premature wilting in your flowers.

With a sharp knife or a clean pair of pruning/garden shears, cut an inch off the bottom of the bokay or each individual flower if you are inserting them individually. Place the stem directly in the water from the cut. This will ensure no air enters the stem. Stems contain vascular bundles, envision a handful of tiny straws each constantly drawing water, much like us breathing. The difference is the stem needs water, not air as our lungs do.

This procedure needs to be repeated every third or fourth day for maximum freshness.

Simply lift your bouquet out of water, clean the vase, then recut the flowers before returning them to fresh water. Why? Well perhaps you've noticed when you've had fresh flowers in the past that on the first morning you wake up and notice your vase needs water so you fill it up. The second morning it needs a fill but not as much as the previous day. Then on day three, what, it's still full?

This shows the flowers stopped drinking. When that happens your prize bokay is ready to wilt. If they are not drinking, they

need to have those stems reopened with a fresh cut and then back to a clean container with fresh preservative water. This will open up those vascular bundles so they are free to continue to hydrate.

Some flowers are more sensitive to stem blockage caused by dirty water or organic material decaying in the water. Roses are the most sensitive. Roses must be recut religiously every third day while others may be okay for a fourth day, at any rate allow the water level to tell you how often to recut.

Never place your flowers near a bowl of fruit. Fruit and vegetables give off ethylene gas. To us it is colourless and odourless to flowers it is toxic and causes premature wilting and tip browning. It is also a good idea to keep flowers away from your sink or food prep area to avoid exposure to ethylene. Ethylene is also produced by cigarette smoke and exhaust from cars.

You know I always liken the prep area in my flower shop as an ER for flowers. As soon as they are cut from their life force they are dying. My job is to keep them alive as long as possible. This means, as in any resuscitation environment, cleanliness is of utmost importance. The counters and containers must be clean as do the utensils we cut them with.

If flowers are not here for our pleasure, what are they here for? Just remember they are a living, organic being and deserve to be treated as such.

I'm excited to celebrate the great year that was 2014 with family and friends. I'm also excited for the year that's on its way, including my first stint as the Chair of a Council committee: the Standing Policy Committee on Utilities and Corporate Services.

Planning of the SW Ring Road, which is many years in the making, will ramp up in a big way during 2015. While the Ring Road itself will be the Government of Alberta's responsibility, I am always willing to discuss what impact it will have on Calgary's communities. The City of Calgary will be working over the coming years to make sure that the most efficient connections are made between the Ring Road and city streets, which is the real goal of Ring Road project (unless you like driving around in circles). Another project that I am excited to see take off in 2015 is the Macleod Trail/162 Avenue Interchange. No, shovels won't be in the ground next year, but the City will be deep into the planning of this major infrastructure project. The interchange is sorely needed at one of the south's busiest intersections, and will compliment the future Ring Road. Again, please don't hesitate to strike up a conversation with me on this topic. Did you know? The City gives away free mulch for gardening.

It's true, and you can pick it up at the East Calgary Landfill (while quantities last). The mulch is produced by a program that recycles the Christmas trees that stand in many living rooms over the next few weeks. You can leave the tree (un-bagged and untied) near your black cart collection spot by Friday, January 9 at 7 a.m., and the City will pick it up within three weeks. Make sure the tree is not blocking the street, lane or sidewalk and is at least one foot (30 centimetres) away from your carts. You can also drop the tree off at one of eight locations from December 26 to January 31, although the Shepard Landfill and the Parks Compound (10312 Sacremento Drive SW) are the best places for Ward 14.
