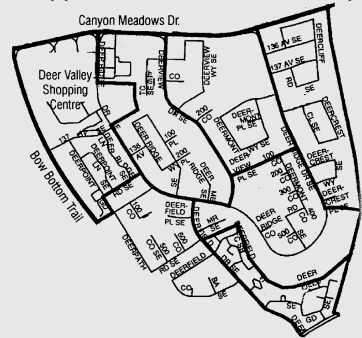

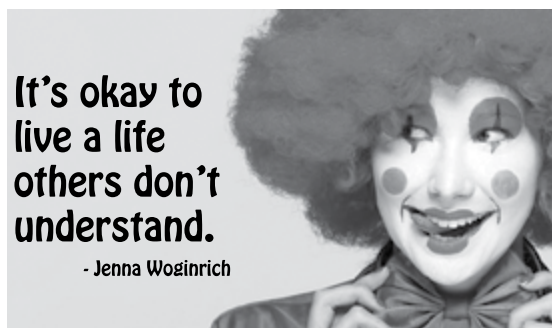

Happy New Year, Ward 14!

As the days get longer, we will settle back into reality after what was hopefully some rest and relaxation with family and friends. Unfortunately, nothing says reality like your property assessment.

Your 2015 Assessment notice will be mailed on January 5. That date also marks the beginning of a 60-day period that is very important for property owners. The Customer Review Period is your opportunity — your only opportunity — to review and ensure the accuracy of your Assessment Notice. Your opportunity will end on March 6.

During this 60-day period you should check that all the details on your notice are correct. Ask yourself if the value given to your property or business is a reasonable estimate, and if it is equitable when compared to similar properties or businesses.

If you have questions or concerns then contact the City's Assessment Department. If you see an error in your notice, there is a good chance that your Assessor will be happy that you

brought it to their attention. So don't be shy, because a quick call could save you making an official appeal. You can find more information at www.calgary.ca/assessment.

In order to settle back into reality you're also going to need to get that tree out of your living room. If you can get your bare tree (un-bagged and untied) to a spot near your black cart collection spot by Friday, January 9 2015 at 7 a.m., the City will pick it up within 3 weeks. If not, you can take it to one of eight locations around the city. For more details, and the addresses of those eight locations you can visit www.calgary.ca/waste.

I was busy in 2014. I'll admit that—due to a lot of time spent focusing on the City's budget deliberations—I have not held as many Aldertalk sessions as I would have liked in the past year.

As I mentioned in December, the first Aldertalk of the year will be on Saturday, January 17 at Parkland Community Hall (505 Parkvalley Rd SE) from noon to 2 p.m., so please join me.

If you would like to learn more about Aldertalk then you should have a quick read of the content on www.calgary.ca/aldertalk. You will find a list of upcoming Aldertalk sessions there, and if you are interested in being reminded of upcoming Aldertalk sessions then you should visit www.calgary.ca/ward14 and fill out the Stay Connected form to sign up for reminders.

I hope 2015 is a great year for you, and that you resolve to let me know if something about the City of Calgary is bothering you. As in the past, feel free to contact me anytime.

Attention Calgary property owners

On Jan. 5, 2015, The City of Calgary will mail the 2015 property assessment notices.

Your notice contains important information, including your Access Code to register for the Assessment Search website.

On the Assessment Search website you can access:

- › detailed information about your own property(s).
- › real estate market sales information used to prepare assessments.
- › summary information on other properties for comparison.

Assessment Search – getting started

First-time users will need to complete a two-step registration process:

1. Create a City of Calgary myID account.
2. Link your property assessment to your myID account. When you receive your 2015 assessment notice in January, go to calgary.ca/assessmentsearch and sign in with your myID. Enter the Roll Number and Access Code displayed on your notice.

Deer Valley Medical Clinic is your local walk-in and family practise medical clinic located in the redesigned Deer Valley Market Place. We are at the corner of Canyon Meadows Drive and Bow Bottom Trail and situated between the CIBC Bank and the Deer Valley Dental Office. No appointments are required, but a few are available every day. We welcome you to come and visit our bright newly constructed space which is adjacent to ample parking.

Deer Valley Medical Clinic has been part of the community since 1982 providing medical services to all the residents of SE Calgary. We have evolved into a clinic providing both walk-in and family practise. We provide continuing care to walk-in patients with ongoing medical needs that require long term management. This would include facilitating access to other health care services, follow-up for lab and x-ray investigations and referrals to other specialized health care services, physicians and health care workers.

We are staffed with a team of licensed family physicians, licensed registered nurses who are supported by our reception staff of medical office assistants. Our senior nurse/administrator has 35 years of nursing experience. We also have staff dedicated to booking referrals to other medical specialists and medical services.

The mission of this clinic is to provide reasonable access to the health care system for people who have a need for health care services but do not have access to a physician. As a walk-in clinic we provide access for patients to see a physician in a very timely manner whatever the medical issue and will continue to manage their medical issues within the clinic if they so wish. We are more than just a walk-in clinic!

We are your family health team that brings together a group of highly skilled health care professionals to provide you with better access to the highest possible quality of coordinated health care and services.

DVMC is designed to create a team approach to health care so that you can see the most appropriate provider for your issues. That team would be the doctors, nurses and other health care professionals who have been consulted, working together to provide the very best care when you need it and in your neighbourhood.

Our Team Includes:

Dr. F. Dean Collett has worked at DVMC for 32 years. He works as a walk-in doctor and has recently moved his family practise to DVMC. He is currently accepting new patients and does booked appointments.

Dr. Kapila Narang has been part of the clinic for 20 years and currently manages her family practise at DVMC. She also sees walk-in patients one day a week.

Dr. A. Wong has been with the clinic close to 20 years and currently sees walk-in patients.

Happy New Year

Wishing my constituents health, happiness, and prosperity in the New Year. It's hard to believe 2015's arrived; days and months disappear like water in a sponge! Thank you to those who visited the constituency office for our Christmas Open House. It's always a pleasure to chat with you one on one and hear, first-hand, your concerns and issues.

Fall Sitting Of the Alberta Legislature

Session resumed shortly after the four by-elections, and it's been a very busy time for all MLA's. I've listed below the Bill Status for what was covered in the fall session.

Bill 1 *Respecting Property Rights Act* – By repealing the Land Assembly Project Area Act, we are responding to Albertans' concerns. Pursuant to the *Property Rights Advocate Act* the 2012-2013 Property Rights Advocate's reports will be referred to committee for review during this fall session. (Committee)

Bill 2 *Alberta Accountability Act* – This bill is on notice to be introduced. (On Notice)

Bill 3 *Personal Information Protection Amendment Act 2014* – This bill will authorize a trade union to collect, use, and disclose personal information about an individual if related to a matter under a labour relations dispute. This amendment to the *Personal Information Protection Act* (PIPA) addresses the Supreme Court of Canada's ruling that if PIPA restricts collection for legitimate labour relations purposes, it is in breach of the Charter of Rights and Freedoms. The government intends that with this bill this government will be protecting Albertans' personal information while balancing a trade union right of freedom of expression. (Committee)

Bill 4 *Horse Racing Alberta Amendment Act 2014* – The proposed amendments will decrease the total board membership from 12 members to 11. This new board structure will also see an increase in public members from three to six, including the board chair. It will consist of five industry-nominated members. (Committee)

Bill 5 *Securities Amendment Act 2014* – Alberta conducts a regular review of Alberta's Securities Act to keep pace with changes in technology, new products, and market innovations and to support the ongoing reform of the system. The amendments cover a variety of topics, including continued harmonization of general derivatives provisions, incorporation of represen-

tatives of registered brokers and advisers, enhanced enforcement provisions, recognition of oversight of the Canadian Public Accountability Board as an auditor oversight organization, fee study provisions, and consequential amendments to related legislation. (2nd Reading)

Bill 6 *Statutes Amendment Act 2014 (No. 2)* – This bill brings together minor and housekeeping amendments to a number of acts under three different ministries. The amendments are intended to streamline and provide efficiency, clarity, and consistency for the individuals and businesses who are affected by the acts. Under municipal affairs changes to the Safety Codes Act; from jobs, skills training and labour, changes to the Workers' Compensation Act, and from agriculture and rural development, housekeeping amendments to combine the Farm Implement Act with the Farm Implement Dealerships Act and repeal of the omnibus Dairy Industry Act of 2002. (2nd Reading)

Bill 7 *Chartered Professional Accountants Act* – This bill brings together the organization of Certified Management Accountants, Certified General Accountants, and Certified Accountants. It was requested of government by the three organizations to make sure that accountants in Alberta have labour mobility and that they are up to date with the national and world standards. (1st Reading)

Bill 8 *Justice Statutes Amendment Act* – The bill updates a number of acts, including the *Court of Queen's Bench Act*, the *Estate Administration Act*, the *Family Law Act*, the *Limitations Act*, the *Notaries and Commissioners Act*, the *Oaths of Office Act*, the *Perpetuities Act*, the *Provincial Court Act*, the *Wills and Succession Act*, and minor housekeeping changes to several other acts. The proposed amendments follow consultation with the judiciary, Alberta's legal community, and members of the public. The government says these stakeholders support the changes. (1st Reading)

Bill 9 *Condominium Property Amendment Act 2014* – This bill is on notice to be introduced. (On Notice)

Bill 10 *Act to Amend the Alberta Bill of Rights to Protect our Children* – is an alternative to Bill 202 on Gay Straight Alliances. At the time of writing it has not been tabled.

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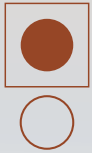

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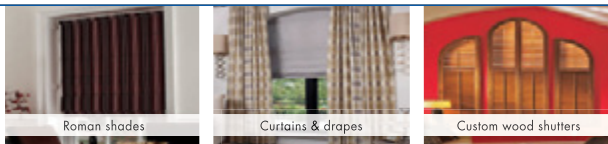


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
