

Hello Ward 14!

April is a transition month here in Calgary. Technically it is spring, but anyone who has been here for more than a year knows that it is spring in name only. We will likely be living with snow on the ground for a little while longer, and although temperatures will gradually be climbing, there is still the definite possibility of some cold weather.

I'm going to blaze the trail into spring this month regardless of the conditions outside, but first let me mention Aldertalk. This month's edition of Aldertalk is on April 11 from noon to 2 p.m. at the Queensland Community Hall (649 Queensland Drive SE). If you can't make it this month, you can find upcoming dates at www.calgary.ca/aldertalk.

City landfills will be taking yard waste free of charge from residential customers again this year. Your chance is from April 17 to May 31, but before you leave for the landfill there are a couple of things you should remember. First, you should only bring things like leaves, branches, and plants (no sod, please). Second, it needs to either be left loose or be in a paper yard waste bag.

It's a great program that really helps the City cut down on waste, and this year yard waste from the September snow-storm will also be accepted. I suggest you take advantage of it, and visit www.calgary.ca/waste.

Another sign of spring is street cleaning. You should keep an eye out for signs on the streets in your neighbourhood starting April 13, because that is when Calgary's Roads department begins its 2015 Spring cleanup program.

By now some Ward 14 communities have been notified of Canada Post's intention to convert their mail service from door-to-door to community mailboxes. While service to those who have been contacted will be converted within the year, all service across the ward, the city, and the country will be converted within the next five years.

Several have contacted my office about the changes, and rightly so. My door is always open, so to speak, and I am always here to listen, but I want to make it clear that Canada Post is leading the engagement process with residents, not the City of Calgary.

Canada Post, under the Federal Canada Post Act, may install, erect or relocate in any public place, including a public roadway, any receptacle or device to be used for the collection, delivery or storage of mail. However, if residents have issues with the sites selected, they should call Canada Post.

I will write again for May. Until then, take care and feel free to contact me anytime.

Non-toxic Cleaning with Green Calgary!

Spring is just around the corner and for many of us that means popping open the windows and cleaning away winter's dust and dirt. But before you start using the cleaners under your sink, take a moment to look at the products you have and examine the ingredients on each of their labels. You might be surprised at what you find (or don't find!).

Labelling on cleaning products is voluntary for cleaning product manufacturers in Canada; so you may not be able to find what you are spraying around the house just by looking at the bottle. Imagine eating a bowl of cereal from a box with no ingredients or an incomplete list of ingredients. What's not being listed that we're exposing ourselves to?

Because there are so few regulations limiting what companies can put into their products, most conventional cleaning supplies (even the ones that say they are "green") contain hazardous ingredients that are known to be harmful to people and the environment.

The one place we can control our exposure is in our homes, by limiting the toxic cleaners and personal care products we bring in.

When shopping for cleaners follow these simple rules:

1. Only choose products with a full listing of ingredients
2. Get to know the ingredients of concern and try to avoid them
3. Look for companies with a dedication to human health and the environment
4. Look for companies with third party certification (such as the Canadian Environmental Choice or EcoLogo)

Another option – and in our opinion, the easiest and most affordable option – is to make products yourself with just a few simple ingredients: white vinegar, baking soda, salt, lemon juice, castile soap and maybe some essential oils.

I'm writing this in late February for a newsletter you will receive in early April. It has always been difficult because, as you're aware, things can change dramatically in a day never mind a month.

Many of you are aware the Premier has been musing about calling an early election. Under provincial legislation, passed only a few years ago, the next general election is to be called sometime between March and May 2016. Despite this, the Premier has openly contemplated ignoring this legislation and calling an election this spring, a full year early.

I think it's important that the constituents of Calgary-Fish Creek realize that this election would be entirely unnecessary, and contrary to Alberta's election laws. The Premier will try to make the argument that because oil prices are low, creating economic uncertainty, he needs a mandate from Albertans. His intention is to introduce a budget and then call an election before Alberta MLAs have a chance to debate and vote on that budget.

After an election, the Premier would have to reintroduce another budget, one I fear will be full of tax increases, and possible attacks on front line workers. He has repeatedly mused about raising taxes, bringing back health care premiums, and other drastic measures. If a budget is not passed before an election, he will have every opportunity to do those things. I think it's important for Calgary-Fish Creek constituents to keep that in mind over the coming weeks.

As many of you already know, I will not be running as your MLA when this election is called. Thank you from the bottom of my heart -- what an honour and privilege it has been to be your elected representative for the last 22 years. Being the MLA for the people of Calgary-Fish Creek has taught me many valuable lessons. I've learned that people are tired of being told what we are going to do for them. Instead, people would rather be asked what we should be doing for them. It's been my privilege to hear from each and every one of you. As they say, in life one door closes and another opens. I look forward to what the future holds for me. To the great staff I've had for many years, Terri, Bev and Jennifer, I could not have done this job without you. I love you all.

Thanks for being a part of my life and as they say, "Happy trails to you, until we meet again."
