Did you know that the first time that Deer Ridge hosted a Movie In the Park event was August 2002? Former Board member Roy Franco was the founder and lead organizer of Movie In The Park Deer Ridge. Here is a bit of background to how it all started in a Q&A with Roy.

When did Movie In The Park (MITP) Deer Ridge begin, how did it start and by whom?

(Roy) MITP started in the winter of 2001/2002 with a discussion with regard to what the DRCA could do for the community as summer event. Having gone on holidays in Montreal in the summer of 2001, I attended Montreal's annual "Eight weeks of summer -Movie in the Park" where they held a movie once a week in a different park in the city. I brought forward the idea of holding a similar event here in our community. Eric Daniels, former president at the

time liked the idea and we started putting the plans into action to hold the first MITP for summer of 2002.

Was the location for MITP Deer Ridge always Yellow Slide Park?

(Roy) The first MITP was held at the green space along Bow Bottom Road by the townhouses. The following years it was always held at Yellow Slide Park. I believe the first event was attended perhaps by around 100 individuals.

Do you remember what the very first movie was that was shown at MITP Deer Ridge?

(Roy) The movie Spiderman was released April of 2002 and I managed to book a copy for our first event. The weekend that we showed Spiderman with approximate attendance of 100, Montreal also showed the same movie at one of their parks with attendance of 3000.

To date, what summer had the biggest turnout?

(Roy) Attendance starting growing when word got around as to what MITP was all about and the idea was being promoted to the surrounding communities as well. I believe it was year 3 or 4 is where we had numbers estimated at about 600 attending our events.

How has MITP Deer Ridge changed over the years?

(Roy) Of course over the years the demographics changed: all the young kids living in Deer Ridge grew up and many left the community, so the attendance had dropped off but we will probably see a growth in attendance as new young families are moving into our community.

The biggest change that I've seen is how the community retailers have stepped forward and supported the event by donating food, drink and prizes for the draw, which we didn't have back at the start. I am glad to see that with a lot of hard work from those of us that have been involved with MITP since inception, that it has turned out to be a successful annual summer event.



Our focus as a board is on student success. We provide leadership by defining the CBE's mission, the results we want to achieve for students, and expectations for how the CBE operates. We then monitor actual performance against these expectations.

To do this work effectively, it's important that we connect with parents and communities on an ongoing basis to understand their priorities and expectations for student success. That is why we held a series of meetings earlier this year to hear from former CBE students, parents and business and community leaders.

At these meetings, we were encouraged to hear many people speak passionately about the importance of providing opportunities for students to develop into well-rounded citizens. While a student's academic success matters, many people said that it is not enough. To be successful in the future, students also need to learn how to participate in a democratic society, adapt to change, work as part of a team and much more.

When we hear these comments from so many people we can see that we're on the right track with our results for student achievement. However, we also heard one big concern with this approach. That is how difficult it is to measure achievement for non-academic results. We do recognize this is a challenge, and it's an issue we'll be looking at more closely. The many suggestions we received about ways to measure student success will be helpful to us.


