CRIME STATISTICS

Deer Ridge Crime Activity was Down in October 2020

The Deer Ridge community experienced 4 crimes in October 2020, in comparison to 9 crimes the previous month, and 2 crimes in October one year ago. Deer Ridge experiences an average of 4.3 crimes per month. On an annual basis, Deer Ridge experienced a total of 52 crimes as of October 2020, which is down 29% in comparison to 73 crimes as of October 2019. Soft and Chewy Ginger Cookies

I had the pleasure of receiving a box of these cookies from Krista last Christmas. I think they were intended to share with visiting family ... so I passed them around ... once. The rest of these delicious little lovelies were all mine.

Ingredients

- 1 cup salted butter, room temperature
- 1 cup granulated white sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 cup molasses
- 2 tablespoons white vinegar
- 5 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 ½ teaspoons baking soda
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon ground ginger
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground cloves

Directions

1. In a stand mixer gradually blend together your butter and sugar. Continue to beat until well combined, and light and fluffy. This takes about 3 minutes.
2. Beat in egg, molasses, and vinegar.
3. Sift all of the dry ingredients together, and then blend them into the wet ingredients, being careful not to over-mix. The dough should come together when you press it in your hands, but not crumble.
4. Divide the dough into two even pieces, wrap each piece of dough in plastic wrap, and refrigerate for 30 to 90 minutes.
5. When the dough is done chilling, preheat oven to 350 degrees. Working in sections, roll the dough to 1/2" thick on a floured surface; cut into desired shapes. Place shapes on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper, or a baking mat. Gather and reroll "scraps" of dough as needed, using all of the dough.
6. Bake at 350 degrees for 7 to 8 minutes. Let the cookies cool on the pan for 5 minutes or so before lifting off the pan.

I love to decorate these with a simple royal icing.

Krista is a Calgary chef and busy young mom, who believes that preparing, fast, tasty, and healthy, home-cooked meals is within reach for today's active families. Krista has a soft spot in her heart for Deer Ridge, where she lived and played, while obtaining her Red Seal Chef Certificate from SAIT Culinary School.

Winter Holiday Fire Safety

Festive celebrations, flickering lights and winter greens are all hallmarks of winter holidays, but they also present fire risks that can quickly turn festivity into devastation.

Check out these tips for keeping you and your family safe during the holidays:

1. Keep pets and children at least three feet away from lit candles, the stove and oven,

especially when cooking.

2. If you're putting up a real Christmas tree, make sure it's fresh and water it daily to prevent it from drying out and becoming a fire hazard.
3. If hanging lights, make sure you are following the manufacturer's instructions about how many lights can be connected to prevent electric shock and fire.
4. Keep anything that can burn away from heat sources. Also, consider using flameless candles as an alternative to real ones when decorating.
5. Don't overload electrical outlets. Plug strings of lights directly into wall outlets and keep the number to a minimum.
6. Replace any strings of lights that have

worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections – these can easily start a fire. Also make sure you're using indoor lights indoors and outdoor lights outdoors.

7. Once the holidays are over, safely and responsibly dispose of your tree, away from your home, garage or anything that could catch on fire.
8. Make sure you have working smoke alarms in your home and create a home escape plan that you have practiced with your family.

Be safe - don't let a fire ruin your holidays!

Alberta Children's Hospital Virtual Physician Visits

Do your kids need to see a doctor, but you're not sure if it's urgent or can wait until tomorrow? Or possibly, their doctor can't see them late in the day, or you just can't get an appointment soon enough? The Alberta Children's Hospital physicians have heard you – and they've opened up an urgent pediatric medical advice service that's delivered virtually, by Pediatric Emergency Physicians.

The Virtual Kids same-day appointment service is available to Alberta families on evenings and weekends. You don't need to leave your home, and there's no cost to you for this service, although valid Alberta Health Insurance is required. If telemedicine access is difficult for you, the physician will call you at the number you provide during the booking.

This service is not designed to replace your child's regular physician, but rather, is complementary to the excellent regular medical care your child is already receiving. Virtual Kids physicians will work collaboratively with your child's regular physician. A record of your child's virtual health visit will be sent to your child's regular doctor.

StoryShare

Do you know, or are you, a senior who would enjoy hearing a story, or has a story to share? Storytelling Alberta (Calgary Chapter) offers StoryShare, a free, friendly, outreach program for seniors who love a good story. There are 3 options, each at no cost to the client:

1. There's an Individual StoryShare Chat, a story delivered to you or someone you love, by a professional storyteller, via phone or video platform. You can share a story, too. There will be a community volunteer available to connect the senior to any needed resources.
2. Join a StoryShare Tellaround by phone or video, and tell a story, or simply listen, in a warm, friendly, group story sharing circle.
3. Or participate in a Legacy Recording, done by phone or video platform, where a senior's story may be recorded, or the senior may be interviewed for their story, as part of the Legacy Project.

This free service is available to all Calgary and area seniors 65 years of age or over. Sessions are also offered in French, Spanish, Urdu, and Dutch. Request a story or give a story – it's the gift of connection, of inclusion, and of a darn good time sharing with others.

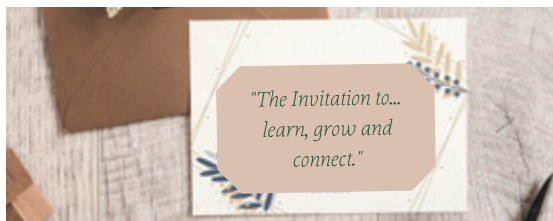

I've made it a new ritual to spend Saturday mornings with my sister and my mother who's 81. We sit around my mom's kitchen table and talk about the world. Our latest visit was so inspiring I had to share it.

My sister is the Principal of a large K-9 school and every year, the District holds an annual *Faith Day*. This year, it was held at each school, due to COVID, so my sister led her team of 55 staff through a day of inspiration. In one of her talks, she relayed a personal story of a time when she had called me for advice (which we do for each other). Instead of sympathizing with her pain, I called her out on what I thought was a "woe is me" attitude. Although I could tell she wasn't happy with my response, I advised her to turn her attention to the lesson and the gift of that lesson.

Once she realized what was happening in our conversation, she had an epiphany, which she shared on that day: "Life doesn't present us with TESTS, it presents us with an INVITATION."

She went on to say, "Sometimes in life we get caught up in a tornado, where we feel like we're spinning. When we're able to pass through the test and get outside of it, we can look back and realize 'Hey, I was in that!'"

When we're *in* it, we don't think clearly.

We all have challenges. We can choose to gripe to others about them, and stay in the tornado. Or we can choose to step out, by accepting the INVITATION to learn, grow and connect; to become stronger, wiser, and better.

Something to ponder: What has been your most recent challenge? What could it inspire you to do or become? Think of even the little daily challenges you have, and turn them into *invitations*. And if someone comes to you, beaten down from life... *invite* them to do the same!

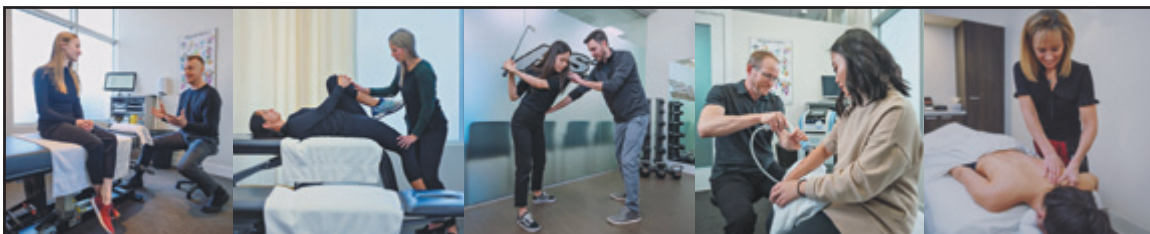
